





GARAGE Talk

fter months of way too much time on the job, I was finally able to spend a few hours of quality "Tri-

umph" time in the garage. While I have a list if items to attend to on the cars, there was nothing that would be considered major, just some things here and there that needed attention. It's hard to disagree with some people when they ask if I'm simply insane or just plain whacked out of my mind when I relate my observations of the world around me.

For example, I think our cars talk to each other when they gather together during club events, shows and general driving around. Just like humans, there is no universal language for vehicles. A TR6 will only understand another TR6, a Spitfire communicates only with another Spitfire, Stags with Stags etc. The conversations among Triumphs can range from sympathy to outright mimicry.

I really don't have much of an oil weepage problem with the Hampshire Triumphs, but sure enough, when they gather with their ISOA brethren, it's open the floodgates time. Let the 5W30 flow!

I have experienced two distinct examples of Stag on Stag conversations. For a few years after the restoration of our 73 Stag, I never had one drip, or any problem with the power steering rack. One day the mimosa yellow "Toolman" Stag shows up in the driveway and starts talking to our sapphire blue Stag. The conversation went something like this:

"Hey Bluey, what's drippin" todav?"

"Nuthin Yella, so far I'm keeping my fluids where they need to be."

"Well Bluey, I need some attention; I'm going to let my owner know that I want something and start weeping red fluid all over driveways, garage floors and anywhere he decides to park me.'

"No way Bluey, you need to show these owners who's boss! Besides, if you want something new, you gotta deploy drastic measures.'

f you have been involved with TRiumphs for any

amount of time, you should be aware that from the introduction of the TRiumph sports car, the cars were raced and raced successfully. The popularity of TRiumph racers "back in the day" makes them a popular choice today. For those of us who enjoy seeing TRiumphs on TRack, there are numerous opportunities. The Midwest is a hot bed of TRiumph racing activities. Due to the age of our cars and the lack of current factory support, there are only a handful of TRiumph racers competing in "current era" racing. Spitfires are still extremely competitive nationally in Sports Car of America race events, able to compete for National and Regional championships against much newer cars. SCCA rule changes favoring modern cars that are currently available for sale have made the TR series of cars somewhat uncompetitive in SCCA production car classes, so most of the big TR's are racing in vintage race events these days.

Thanks to the Midwestern Council of Sports Car Clubs (MCSCC), the Sportscar Vintage Racing Association (SVRA), and the Vintage Sports Car Drivers Association (VSCDA), the TRiumph racing fan has many nearby opportunities to see our favorite sports cars on TRack. VSCDA and SVRA sanction vintage race events, while the MCSCC host current era races that also include a vintage race group. Any of the events sanctioned by these organizations should satisfy the appetite of the TRiumph racing fan. AUTOCROSS

Want to exercise your TR but don't want to go all out racing? There are numerous opportunities for this activity, commonly known as autocross. Many of us got a taste of autocross at the VTR Convention, and there has been a request for more of these events. In an autocross event, you drive your TR on a closed course, 1 car at a time against the clock. The idea is to compete against other cars without actually going wheel to wheel with them. These events can take place in parking lots (low speed events) or on a race TRack (high speed events). Either way, you get the opportunity to test your driving skills as well as the handling capabilities of your car. If you choose to attend an autocross event, you should expect your car to be inspected for safety. A typical tech inspection will include checking for dangerously worn tires and/or suspension. loose batteries. loose articles in the trunk or passenger area, and excessive fluid leaks (normal drips are typically overlooked). You will be expected to remove hub caps or trim rings, and have working seat belts. Helmets are required, and

some organizations will have loaner helmets available.

The Chicagoland MG Club hosts a series of autocross events, and we have been invited to join them. All 4 of their events are low speed, parking lot events. DO NOT equate low speed with boring or unchallenging. The location is the parking lot of the Warrenville Cantera Theater, 28250 Diehl Road. Warrenville. This location is west of Winfield Road and south of I-88. All of the MG Club events start at 9:00 AM, have an entry fee of \$15.00/driver, and are typically over around 1:00 PM. Entrants are expected to help manage the course (pick up knocked over pylons, help with timing, etc) when their group is not staged to go onto the course. The dates for the Chicagoland MG Club autocrosses are:

April 23, June 25, August 27, October 15

Feel the need for a bit more speed? MCSCC, the same group that hosts wheel to wheel events, also hosts high speed autocross events at local race tracks. While MCSCC would like you to be a member of one of their member clubs in order to autocross with them, they do not require membership. MCSCC autocross events have specific requirements for clothing while competing, as well as helmet requirements. You should NOT expect them to provide loaner helmets. You should also do some pre-event preparation. Go to www.mcscc.org, and download the autocross rules as well as the tech inspection sheet. Doing all of these things will prevent unhappy surprises when you arrive at the track. MCSCC autocross dates are:

DuPage Swap Meet & Autojumble

ne of the first signs of spring to an ISOA member is the annual British Car/Part Swap Meet sponsored by the MG club held on the last Sunday in February at the DuPage County Fairgrounds. This year marked the 10th year that the Morris Garage disciples brought together an eclectic, to say the least, group of vendors of used and abused British car parts from as far away as Tennessee and Minnesota.





Even though internet auctions have radically transformed the purchasing of "previously titled" parts, there's nothing quite like pawing through a bushel basket of greasy, rusty "stuff" in the flesh.



Event organizers informed your humble and obedient scribe that over 100 spaces were rented out, and that they anticipated admission sales of nearly 1000 LBC afficionados seeking that special part heretofore thought to be NLS. Good deals abounded and the ISOA contingent of bargain seekers exceeded 30 by our unofficial count. As usual, ISOA also sponsored a PR booth, hoping to discourage any non-ISOA Triumph owners from joining the club. There were actually some new members who joined, despite the best efforts of the booth workers to discourage them.

The event is a great way to beat the midwinter TR withdrawal blues that afflict us this time of year and, in fact, provides a chance to reconnect with many club members we haven't seen since the sun made its annual disappearance, about two years ago, or so it seems.









(Dave "Stumpy Joe" Kayson has done it again. He is now the owner of a 1959 TR3A, in addition to another TR3A, a TR4, 2 TR 250s and a 2 TR6's. Someone stop him before he buys again!

While on the subject of "serial buyers," Peter "Maestro" Conover has acquired another Aston Martin. He writes, "It's true: I'm "Seeing Double." They are very similar cars: the one I have now is AM300/3/1380 (the 80th [of 551] DB MkIII made), the new one is AM300/3/1391 (the 91st DB MkIII made); so they are 11 chassis numbers apart, their motor numbers are 4 apart (as the factory didn't match motors with chassis sequentially), according to the original factory build sheets, they were both originally Black cars with Red interiors. The big difference is that one has a complete interior and the mechanicals apart, the other has no interior but complete mechanicals.

We look forward to the rest of y'all visitin' our great state and enjoyin' our hospitality.



ongress today announced that the office of President of the United States of America will be outsourced to India as of November 17th. The move is being made to save the President's \$400,000 yearly salary, and also a record \$521 billion in deficit expenditures and related overhead the office has incurred during the last 5 years.

"We believe this is a wise move financially. The cost savings should be significant," stated Congressman Thomas Reynolds (R-WA). Reynolds, with the aid of the Government Accounting Office, has studied outsourcing of American jobs extensively. "We cannot expect to remain competitive on the world stage with the current level of cash outlay," Reynolds noted. Mr.. Bush was informed by email this morning of his termination. Preparations for the job move have been underway for sometime. Gurvinder Singh of Indus Teleservices, Mumbai, India will be assuming the office of President as of November 18th.

Mr.. Singh was born in the United States while his Indian parents were vacationing at Niagara Falls, thus making him eligible for the position. He will receive a salary of \$320 (USD) a month but with no health coverage or other benefits. It is believed that Mr. Singh will be able to handle his job responsibilities without a support staff. Due to the time difference between the US and India, he will be working primarily at night, when few offices of the US Government will be open.

"Working nights will allow me to keep my day job at the American Express call center, "stated Mr. Singh in an exclusive interview. "I am excited about this position. I always hoped I would be President someday."

A Congressional Spokesperson noted that while Mr. Singh may not be fully aware of all the issues involved in the office of President, this should not be a problem because Mr. Bush was not familiar with the issues either. Mr. Singh will rely upon a script tree that will enable him to respond effectively to most topics of concern. Using these canned responses, he can address common concerns without having to understand the underlying issues at all.

"We know these scripting tools work," stated the spokesperson. "President Bush has used them successfully for years." Mr. Singh may have problems with the Texas drawl, but lately Bush has abandoned the "down home" persona in his effort to appear intelligent and on top of the Katrina situation.

Bush will receive health coverage, expenses, and salary until his final day of employment. Following a two week waiting period, he will be eligible for \$240 a week unemployment for 13 weeks. Unfortunately he will not be eligible for Medicaid, as his unemployment benefits will exceed the allowed limit.

Mr. Bush has been provided the outplacement services of Manpower, Inc. to help him write a resume and prepare for his upcoming job transition. According to Manpower, Mr. Bush may have difficulties in securing a new position due to limited practical work experience. A Greeter position at Wal-Mart was suggested due to Bush's extensive experience shaking hands and phony smile.

Another possibility is Bush's re-enlistment in the Texas Air National Guard. His prior records are conspicuously vague but should he choose this option, he would likely be stationed in Waco, TX for a month, before being sent to Iraq, a country he has visited. "I've been there, I know all about Iraq," stated Mr.. Bush, who gained invaluable knowledge of the country in a visit to the Baghdad Airport's terminal and gift shop.

Sources in Baghdad and Falluja say Mr. Bush would receive a warm reception from local Iraqis. They have asked to be provided with details of his arrival so that they might arrange an appropriate welcome.

TRIUMPH IN THE NEWS



TRIUMPH HOPES TO BE All-Male Burg on TV



Triumph wants to win. The hard-tofind hamlet is poised to discover national attention. The LaSalle County town is one of three burgs under consideration for an innovative reality-TV special that would strip away half of Triumph's 50 residents.

Specifically all of the women.

"The Week the Women Went" aims to see what happens in a community when man have to fend entirely for themselves. The two-hour program will run next year on the BBC's The Learning Channel, whose producers started calling Triumph a few weeks ago.

"At first I thought it was a hoax," says Cherie Barth, 43, who with her husband runs the Curl Inn one of the town's four businesses. "How'd you get Triumph?"

Indeed, the uninitiated can have a hard lime finding the unincorporated bung. -It quietly sits off the beaten path approachable only by twisting country roads.

"We consider ourselves to be in the middle of nowhere." Barth says with a grin.

In 1834, a handful of settlers called the area Lafayette, then redubbed it Hardscrabble. Sometime in the 1840's, with a post office coming to town, leaders decided on Triumph — though the reasons remain unclear.

"It has been told," according to a town history published in 1976. "that some of the men were sittin' and whittlin' and talkin', and when Mr. J.H. Worsley got up, walked to the door and took a piece of chalk and wrote the word Triumph on the door." In the late 19th century Triumph prospered as a whistle-stop for a passenger railroad, boasting a barbershop, pool hall and two hotels, plus a factory and a pair of lumber companies.

In time, though, the passenger rail stopped coming. Though a freight train rumbles through once a day, the business district now holds only a bank, grain elevator, restaurant and a bar and grill.

For decades, the town served as a comfortable bedroom community to bigger nearby places like Peru and Mendota. Inside Triumph's tidy modest homes live a mix of youths, teens, parents and old folks.

The widespread demographic helped point BBC producers toward Triumph. Last week, they paid a visit, interviewing townsfolk to gauge their interest in participating in the show

Says executive producer Cassie Braben, I think the deciding factor (in the BBC's choice for the shows setting) is how much a town is up for it, as a sort of on entertaining social experiment.

All of the adult women be whisked away for a to an as-yet-unspecified resort hotel. The men would be left to tend for their kids and run the businesses - and without the help of any mothers-in-law or other female interlopers.

Just three households have shown a reluctance to participate, and only because of medical problems precluding travel. Otherwise, the response in Triumph has been overwhelmingly positive.

"You say 'free resort for a week' and the women already have their toothbrushes in a bag," says Assistant postmaster Mary Brester. ".., We're hoping it's somewhere south, where it's warm."

Meanwhile, the men have been brainstorming ways to survive womanless

For one, they'll have to figure out what to do with the children. Though kids are bused to Mendota for school, many have after-school lessons and activities that require intricate transportation and child-watching schemes.

Further, they'll have to pick up the slack in Triumph's small workforce. For instance, the Curl Inn, a polished supper club that draws from all around the Illinois Valley would be without its main cook and all six waitresses — plus co-owner Barth, the prep-cook.

Husband and co-owner Ken Barth smiles sheepishly and says, "I wouldn't have any clue."

So far, no one, not even the men, has expressed much worry over the potential toss of (ahem) marital privileges.

"I can go for a week without sex — I have many times," Ken Barth. 43, says with a hearty chuckle.

Though the program might capture Triumph menfolk at their frantic worst, they're willing to go under a little on-screen embarrassment in the name of civic duty In return for cooperation by the chosen town, the BBC will finance a community project to be undertaken by men during die week of filming.

In Triumph, that could mean the building of a playground or the installation of a first-ever town sign. Or, with Triumph overrun with stray cats the men could launch a spay-andneuter campaign — which could make for interesting television, considering Triumph has no veterinarian.

The BBC will pick a town next month. Filming is expected in either March or April.

The other places under consideration are Jamestown. Colorado, home to 205 residents near Boulder; and Long Island, Maine, whose 202 residents live on a tiny island off Portland.

As the BBC ponders its choice, Triumph eagerly awaits a chance to show its stuff. Cherie Barth, no doubt eyeing a week's vacation, smiles as she tells her husband, "its going to take some work."

DARWIN **A**WARDS



The Darwin Awards are an annual honor given to the person who did the gene pool the greatest service by killing themselves in the most extraordinarily stupid way..

Last year's winner was the fellow who was killed by a Coke machine which toppled over on top of him as he was attempting to tipa free soda out of it.

Warren Carmichael, a police spokesman, said investigators think Barcia was alone because his car was found nearby. "The length of the cord that he assembled was greater than the distance between the trestle and the ground" Carmichael said. Police say the apparent cause of death was "Major trauma."

3. A man in Alabama died from rattlesnake bites. It seems that he and a friend were playing a game of catch, using the rattlesnake as a ball. The friend, no doubt a future Darwin Awards candidate, was hospitalized.

According to a Health Ministry report issued last month, some 29 percent of men aged 20-60 are overweight compared with 24 percent in 2000.

The <u>Triumph</u> spokeswoman, however, said most of the demand is due to new styles in pants that are cut to emphasize the hips. "It's really more about style," she said. "After all, there aren't that many men in their 20s and 30s whose figures are giving way."




n the February edition of the "Snic Braaap," Mike Mueller made the following comment about the color Sienna Brown, "not my, or anyone else that I know
